Teen Magician to Represent USA in Adult Competition
On April 29th Sterling Dietz, from Lynden,
Washington, represented the USA in the Adult
International Stage competition at the XXXI World

Magic Seminar in Las Vegas. The competition held at The Orleans Casino and Resort is sponsored by legendary magicians, Siegfried and Roy. The competition brought together magicians representing countries from around the world. "I know



Korea, Japan, Germany, and Greece were represented in the magical stage performance for sure". Seventeen-year-old Sterling Dietz is the first American teenager to be allowed to compete and represent the United States in the adult competition. Sterling competed for the Sarmoti and Gold Lion Head awards along with \$10,000.00 in prize monies. Last year magicians from Germany and France took the top two awards and prize money. Sterling's response when asked how it felt to be asked to compete said "It is such an honor to be entrusted with this responsibility, and I need to take my magic to another level, and bring my very best." This will be a good test for young Sterling as he prepares for F.I.S.M. (the Olympics of magic) to be held in Beijing in 2009. Come to the club meeting May 8th & hear the results.
