March 2014 MEETING

March's theme was – Show Me the Money, Effects with money.

George Zuk demonstrated a Tenyo effect. He had a frame and inside the frame was a piece of metal. George held the frame upright and had a spectator place a die behind the frame so the spots on top of the die could not be seen. Yet George was able to determine the number of spots on the top of the die. The spectator then placed two dice behind the frame and George was able to write on a dollar bill the numbers on the top of each die. Last the spectator took a card and cover the face with another card and placed both against the metal interior of the frame and George was able to determine the value of the card.

Craig Colombel talk about buying his lunch at a grocery store and only had \$3. But after buying the \$2 special he found he still had \$3 dollars. This continue for a couple of times until Craig only had \$1 left but with a magical gesture he turned the dollar bill into a credit card.

Ralph Huntzinger told us that magic showed have 3 beats and to demonstrate he brought out a glass goblet and a small glass dish. He then ask the spectator to imagine 3 coins a dollar coin, a fifty cent piece and a quarter. The spectator was to then think of one and imagined if the coin was heads or tails. The thought of coin was produce with the proper side showing. Ralph turned the Goblet upside down on the dish and placed the coin on the goblet and it passed through the goblet to the dish. Ralph then donated the Goblet and dish to the raffle.

Joe Martinek had a deck of cards and 4 quarters. He offered to teach the spectator how to play poker, starting off on how to deal. Joe then had the spectator deal down some cards down in piles and then collect the piles into 4 piles. The spectator then placed a quarter on each pile. The spectator then turn over the top card of each pile and each was an ace. Joe then use the Aces and quarters and performed a matrix effect. JR using a stack of coins showed us a bar bet. We were asked to estimate what was the height of the stack. Was the height the same as a quarter, a nickel, a penny or a dime stood on end. If you were not there to find out, I will let you find out at the cost of a beer someday. JR then spread out the stack of coins and had the spectator go through the process of a series of turnovers of the coins, this without JR looking. JR then had the spectator pick one coin and JR was able to predict whether it was heads or tails. JR talked about having a show in a coin purse performing coin magic and also showed us a protector of his paper to money routine that he made.

Danny Dragon had bought the Elmesly's book and was working on developing his Elmesly's count (ghost count) and working on routines to use it with. Danny demonstrated one trick he was working on from the book.

Master Payne showed us a routine that he was working on for the Moister Fest coming up in Seattle. Using a blindfolded spectator, Payne made the spectator feel a metal coat hanger go through parts of their body. It was Payne's interpretation of a Carney effect. Payne then performed a kid's show effect by having us guess what was in an envelope, a hint it was a green animal. As we guess a frog he showed that it was a green rabbit. He coved the rabbit with a white cloth and with some funny business showed that the rabbit was now white. After several times putting the card behind his back and not showing both sides of the card. He finally relented and showed that the rabbit turned into a green frog with the back of the card blank.

After the performances there was a raffle of donated magic items. So come to the meeting to get a chance to win the raffle and perform for more chances.



Ordered a couple of items and thought I would provide my thoughts.

- 1. Bently the bending paper clip. You probably have seen the ad by now for this. I bit and luckily I was able to turn around and sell the DVD on Ebay and almost recoup my investment. The problem with the effect are twofold. One the paper clip does not bend 180 as shown in the trailer. This seems to be the most common complaint. I cannot get it to go past 90 still a good bend. My biggest complaint is the action of the bend in a real psychokinetic experiment the bend would be slow Bently springs up quickly then slows down it almost suggest the method. You may like the effect but I rated it a 2 star.
- 2. Library.com I downloaded "Scripting and Story Telling for Paranormal Entertainers" This is a guide that walks you through scripting a story, developing a theme and character. I am really delighted in this publication and recommend it those who want to learn scripting.
- 3. If you ever wanted to learn Cold Reading may I recommend "James Bond Cold Reading" This is a very easy learn method the author has developed a memory system as well as flash cards for learning Cold Reading. He also has written several other books One I am currently reading is: Learning Star Signs". Again simple memory system and flash cards. Secrets of Mind Reading and Telepathy Revealed

In the foreword to his opus Mr. Engstrand tells us that it is "written in a simplistic style with a minimum number of words". This he says was done to allow the reader to "focus on the effect" and allow them to create a presentation that will be a "reflection of their own personality rather than copying the presentation of other performers". An admirable endeavor which unfortunately in this case doesn't manage to hit the mark.

Unfortunately the style is too simplistic. The book reads more like the old "101 Easy Tricks You Can Do" pamphlet that was included in the old Adam's Magic Sets than a serious volume on the performance of mental magic. Important details in the handling of certain effects are inadequately explained or pertinent details left out making some of the tricks unworkable as written. His explanation of the Gilbreath Principle leaves out an all important detail. At least one effect simply doesn't work at all.

Those that do work are far from being anywhere near the cutting edge of modern mentalism. Many fall into the old "Think of a number. Add seven to it. Divide it by twelve. Subtract your original number. You're number is eighteen" category.

Of the 29 effects in the book eight of them are card tricks. Half of the remaining 21 feats fall more into the category of impromptu or bar bet stunts than routines one would actually include in a formal presentation mental magic. Apart from a progressive anagram lifted from T. A. Waters "Mind Myth & Magic" none of the material contained in the book is credited. But this really isn't an issue since a great deal of it is in the public domain. The old 1089 prediction trick is in there as well as the workings of a very, very basic magic square. There really is nothing in the book that the average mentalist would already not be familiar with. Which presents the publisher of this thin volume with a bit of a quandary. Since the book is too "simply" written to be of much use to the novice performer yet contains little if any information of value to the serious performer. There really is no viable market for this book that I can see.


