March's theme was "Tribute-Perform or discuss something by one of your favorite creators, or from one of your favorite genres of magic.

The date for the 3 of Clubs convention was announced (Oct 19-21). The next lecture date was announced, and club business was discussed.

Brian Melicher told the club about finding some interesting and good magic books that can be found at Half-Price Books for a good price. Also, Half-Price Books moved the magic books from games to arts.

Evan Reynolds started off the evening bring out two slates, showed us the blank fronts and backs. He tied them together with a piece of chalk in between the two slates. He put the slates aside and brings out a newspaper. He had people each pull a section of the paper out and discarded the removed section. Evan tore the paper in half and again had members of the audience remove parts. He continued to do this until he has one piece left. Evan then had a spectator touch a word on that piece. Another volunteer opens the slates and now there was a word written in chalk on one of the slates and that word matched the word on the piece of paper.

Ralph Huntzinger's magic used three ropes in which he told a story about life, the ropes representing Childhood, maturity and old age. He tied the ropes together, then removed one, moved the knot on the remaining two and untied them with one of the ropes now shorter than the other. He discarded the short rope and threaded the rope through a wooden block. The ending of the story included the rope penetrating the block.

Dave Callaham took out three cards, one with a picture of a caterpillar, one with a picture of a cocoon and one blank. He dealt the cards into a spectator's hand and when he asks the spectator to wave his hand over the cards there was a butterfly on the back of the spectator's hand. Dave then brought out a pencil and made the logo disappear and reappear, move the logo to the other end of the pencil, removed the logo again and ended with the words being stretched out on the pencil.

Payne had three credit cards one with the word clone on it. By placing the clone card on the other two the word clone appeared on the other two cards. This was an item he reviewed. He is also reviewing manipulation bills. Rich Waters showed us something he was working on, he found in Genii Magazine. He takes the four aces out of the deck, loses them back in the deck and then finds them by dealing. He did this with a story about rock stars.

Rarely will I be able to accurately guide you through the genealogy of the tricks reviewed in this article. I can only tell you if I like something (usually based on clever principles, promising ideas, and/or the reactions they elicit), **or not**.

These opinions are of items I purchased (not freebies) based on my own interest in them.

The Three Pellet Test

Limited Edition

By Ted Karmilovich

\$50 (Stevens Magic)

Ted Karmilovich's name is certainly recognizable to me, however I can't say that I've ever read any of his other published material prior to receiving this item. Now that I have, I will likely explore more of his work.

The routine relies on two key principles which may be recognizable to some readers, but the combination of these ideas allows for a strong presentation, and even though I have not performed this live, I can imagine just how strong it could be.

This is taught as a three phase routine.

The Ad Copy Says...:

The spectator is handed three slips of paper. The performer also has three slips of paper. They each write identical words on their individual slips. For example, red, white, and blue are written on the performer's three slips and written by the spectator on their three slips.

They each ball up their slips, mix them in their cupped hands, and drop them to the table. The performer (who always chooses FIRST), selects one of the spectator's crumpled balls. The spectator then chooses one of the performer's crumpled balls. They are opened up and the colors match! This is repeated with the two remaining pellets. The performer picks one of the spectator's two remaining pellets and then the spectator selects one of the performer's. They are both opened to reveal a match again!

And, of course, the remaining two pellets match!

Showing that is wasn't just a coincidence, the performer repeats the sequence TWO MORE TIMES using different words resulting in a total of NINE matches!

The principles employed are put to clever use. I love a trick that puts the work up front, leaving you time to focus on the presentation rather than the execution of the mechanics of the trick throughout your performance. Additionally, this is totally impromptu, and can be (is encouraged to be) repeated. In fact, the three phases are literally repeat performances of the first phase, with slight variation.

What you receive...

A well written 16-page manuscript offers an introduction, presentation and explanation, all of which is very clearly described and includes performance tips and other subtleties.

The author also includes two bonus items: "Target Coin," and "Ashes on Palm."

Target Coin will only be of use to you if you already own a fairly expensive prop (which, actually, many mentalists probably do have). It's a clever use for the prop, and the routine can be performed on stage to a large crowd. In terms of "packing small" the required items (6 coins and the aforementioned prop) would take up only a small portion of your pocket (other than the required, unprepared wine glass or water goblet).

Ashes on Palm is Karmilovich's take on the classic effect. He employs a common object (and shares a wonderful tip from Eugene Burger) to assist with getting into and out of the required "state of readiness."

I will say that the price tag on this one seems a bit high, and I assume that it is due to the fact that this is being labeled a "limited" release, although it is not clear how many manuscripts have been, or will be printed. Despite the price I do not regret my purchase, and I am happy to have been introduced to Karmilovich's work. Keep in mind that The Three Pellet Test is intended for a small audience, and perhaps best when performed one-on-one.

Notes to Self: 5 Seconds

If I were to suggest one book that will change your life, that will kick your personal, professional as well as performing into high gear. To help stop procrastinating and get moving towards your goals no matter what they are.... would you be interested? Look no further than "The 5 Second Rule" by Mel Robins.

The concept is simple- we can make changes with a 5 second decision. Based on current science this technique really works. The book lays out a simple step by step program that will motivate you to accomplish your goals.

So why do I recommend this to the Magic community? Do you procrastinate in learning new material, going out and performing or getting more gigs? You know you should make changes but get overwhelmed? You are only 5 seconds away from making the changes required to move you in the direction you want to go.
