President's Message

July 2014 MEETING

Totally Mental Night – Performances of Mental magic –or- magic that drives people crazy!

Your secretary was not able to make July's meeting and thus the notes this time are by your illustrious President Jim Rodgers

Jim Earnshaw started off the evening's Magic with his Okito Box routine. I couldn't have possibly made notes on his entire routine, even if I had remembered sooner that I was supposed to be taking notes. Jim amazed us for several minutes using his Okito box, 4 coins, a wand and his sleight of hand skills.

Jeff Dial performed a Mentalism effect by Jim Steinmeyer. Ten pairs of cards were used. Each of four people had to select a pair of cards and remember them. The pairs of cards were separated and mixed. Jeff then dealt them out into a grid pattern some cards face-up and some face-down. By knowing one card of the spectator's cards, Jeff divined all 4 of the second cards.

Jeff Simmons entertained the Club with a Mentalism effect with rock, paper and scissors cards and three differently colored Warrior cards – Red, White and Blue. The Warriors and their 'weapons' were paired on the table. Jeff turned his back and the rock, paper and scissors cards were mixed. Jeff was able to tell the Club which one Warrior could currently beat which other – using their rock, paper and scissor 'weapons'. This was repeated several times. Jeff is still working the bugs out of this effect, but it showed promise!

Jim Rodgers performed a version of Max Maven's effect 'Centrifugal Combination'. Twenty cards with symbols and numbers were displayed. The cards were mixed and a spectator dealt them into five hands. A hand was chosen and the cards were passed out to other spectators. Jim divined which spectators had symbols, which had numbers, and exactly what was on all of the spectator's cards.

Master Payne performed Shawn Farquhar's "Sheer-Luck" effect. A spectator was handed a book (The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes) and was asked to stand back to back with Master Payne. The spectator named a page of the book and turned to that page. Master Payne told the spectator numerous details about the chosen page and even sited passages. This effect is a comedy Mentalism effect and has a fabulous burn at the end.

Augusts' meeting is likely to be a Magic Free-for-all –no theme! See you on the 14th!

A few years back Anders Moden created a truly remarkable feat. Healed and Sealed, the visibly resurrected soda can. It would have remained an undiscovered gem, a feat worthy enough to propel a lucky handful of magicians to legendary status had not David Blaine let the cosmic cat out of the bag by performing it on his fourth magic special Vertigo. Needless to say seconds after Mr. Blaine popped the top of that revitalized soft drink the internet was instantly abuzz with speculation, conjecture and of course crass unauthorized copies.

Fortunately Sean Scott's most recent foray into the ever interesting field of what has erroneously become known as "Street Magic" is not one of them. Not only is Modosu a totally new method, it's a completely different presentation for a crushed and restored can as well.

The effect is thus. While walking down the street you come across a totally flattened can of energy drink. For some reason you feel compelled to pick it up and show it to your companions or anyone else that might be on the street at the time. Odder still you have someone initial the can with the sharpie that seems to be standard issue for members of the guerilla magic set. You then casually stroll eight to ten feet away from your impromptu audience. Cast the can upon the pavement and then, with a certain amount of gusto, stomp on it with your Doc Martin. An instant later you raise your foot to reveal a completely uncrushed can of Red Bull sitting there, just like new. Pretty close to where the old one sat. The amazingly restored and only slightly shifted can is then picked up and shown to the spectator who confirms that the signature on the top of the can is indeed the exact same one they scribbled there mere moments ago. While all are marveling at this modern day miracle they have just witnessed you reach into your pocket for a damp rag which you use to wipe the top of the can off with. Not only cleaning it in preparation of giving the energy drink as a gift to your helper, but also completely removing that possibly incriminating spectator's signature as well.

That's it. Now for the draw backs. As already stated there are some visual inconsistencies. The eagle eyed viewer could possibly note that not only does the restored can not make its appearance exactly where the crushed one was last seen. But also the spectator's signature vanishes when the flattened can is tossed on the pavement and reappears only when the can is lifted back up. This trick, as it comes in the box, can only accommodate the smaller diameter energy drink sized cans. On the instructional DVD Mr. Scott does say it could be modified to accommodate a regulation size soda can. But to do so will require a trip to the hardware store as well as finding a pair of much baggier pants to wear. While at the hardware store you'll also need to pick up some duct tape, a wrench and a screw driver, some adhesive (Mr. Scott uses super glue but I would recommend epoxy or JB Weld) and, unless you're willing to sacrifice the finish on the table top Mr. Scott suggests using to bend the gimmick into proper alignment, a vice. Yes, this is a magic craft project as some assembly is required and minor modifications need to be made to the gimmick in order for it to work. Nothing major nor beyond the abilities of your average magician, But it will not work right out of the box.

One also needs to be wearing flat soled tie on shoes and long legged loose fitting pants. Slip on shoes, boots or shoes with a defined heel won't work. Neither will shorts or tight or form fitting trousers. Unstylish as they may be flair legged jeans or elephant leg pants would be a plus. You will have to slightly modify a shoe and walk around with a minor lump in the bottom of it. This is a young man's trick as the wearing of orthotics may interfere with the proper alignment and stability of the gimmick.

As for the angles, they pretty standard. Your audience needs to be eight to ten feet away and cannot be standing behind you or too far off to your sides. The flattened can is also gimmicked so it either needs to be planted ahead of time or carried with you to be casually plucked out of the trash or from behind a tree at some point. Reset time is nominal. Just the amount of time it takes to excuse yourself to a private are so you can slide a can of Red Bull into the gimmick. About five seconds.

An instructional DVD is provided. This is well produced and gives you all the performances tips and information you need to make the final adjustments to the gimmick in a clear and easy to follow manner. Additional uses for the gimmick are demonstrated and include both ideas that could be used with playing cards and jumbo coins. So if you're aching to perform a feat that can best be described as a real time special effect and are willing to walk about town with a can of Red Bull strapped to your ankle then this is the trick for you.

Keep in mind that it's a street trick. It would make little sense in formal show as you really need the impromptuness of coming across a flattened can lying in the gutter to demonstrate your miraculous powers on. It would lose all of its credibility if you simply reached into your magic kit and pulled out a flattened to restore. It moves it from possible miracle to most likely trick.

This is the same problem I have with Healed and Sealed. In the right time and place it is a miracle that people will talk about for years and years. Put into a show it just becomes a trick. It is a feat best done completely impromptu. Picking up a seemingly discarded soda can as you're leaving the event and then resurrecting it while the guy is writing out your check is a far more powerful and memorable event than picking it up during your show and restoring it while the whole room watches. Legends are born from the former presentation, not the latter.
