Double Clip Line

Devin Knight has updated the classic mental magic trick Clip Line making it an effect that will perplex both laymen and magicians alike. He has expanded on the original effect by using two strips of newsprint and has added a clever subtly that effectively negates the spectator thinking that you might have turned the paper end for end. His new method uses two strips of newspaper which are clearly numbered 1 and 2. Both strips are held together as a single unit and sections are then cut off both the top and bottoms of them until the spectator tells you to stop. The spectator then reads the top line of one slip and the bottom line of the other only to find that they match the prediction they have been holding for the entire time perfectly. I really like the addition of the second slip of newspaper as it makes the feat difficult to back track and allows you much more cover when you do that secret something that is required to make the feat function.

For those that believe that the second slip of paper muddles the effect or makes it feel too gimmicky Mr. Knight has generously provided two different single slip methods for your perusal. One of which can actually be done in the spectator's hands.

Both of these methods however are not as clean as the first. One requires a two-way envelope (provided) while the second is accomplished through a mathematical force.

While I much prefer the two-slip method the two single slip versions are good to have as a fall back for repeat performances or even for booking purposes as the third "No-Touch" (as he calls it in the manuscript) method can be done via the phone. Or better yet, you could have them follow your directions via a YouTube video. All the methods require a few minutes of setup time and of course can only be used once. But there is no reason why you couldn't make up a score or two of these at a time and keep them in your case for future use.

This is another pack flat yet plays big type of effect that could either be a feature of your performance or kept on hand as a filler when you need to stretch out a show.

So, for a trick that costs far less than a good night out on the town you have yourself a winner with this one.
