The cards were mixed faced down by the volunteer. Then he dealt the cards face up one at a time with Craig indicating how the card predicted his coming life span. Went through the whole packet and the black card had disappeared.

Payne informed us that he found a source of super-soft realistic foam food. He showed us a cake that he got and said the company had other food items to sell. Look for "Giant Stress Toys" He also informed us that "Fab Foods" is back.

After having the volunteer mix the cards under the table, the cards were brought out from under the table and when examined all of one color was facing up and all the other was facing down.

Rich then had the volunteer return the packet, so all were facing the same way. He had the volunteer look at the top card and remember and turn back over on the packet. The packet was then placed under the table and cards mix and when brought out from under the table the chosen card was the only one face up.

Evan Shuster had a volunteer pick a packet of cards, then had him deal out four piles, one pile was chosen by the volunteer and had the top card revealed, it matched the card in Evan's wallet.
