Craig Colombel performed a routine by Juan Tamariz were a packet of mixed up red and black cards representing the chaos of life after being shuffled and dealt into pairs by the spectator the pair kept by the spectator was the only one of matching colors.

Joe Martinek using three cards, the Jack of Clubs sandwich between the 2 Jokers, showed a routine that had the Jack penetrating through the Jokers.

For a change of pace Brian Melicher performed a ring and rope routine he was working on. It used the Hunters Knot and the Bowtie Knot.

JR had everyone take out 8 cards, discard 4 and shuffled the cards and looked at their bottom card. He then had everyone spelled Einstein performing and down and under deal and the last card was the looked at bottom card.

Jeff Dial performed a gambling demo playing poker. He had two packets of cards and allowed the spectators to choose which cards the performer got and which one they got. No matter how they chose the performer always got the winning hand. This was even with the spectators seeing the faces of the cards and being allow to switch cards.

Master Payne showed us the table he built using table legs he got from eBay, he bought the stand and case of DJ Hero and used the legs on a table top he had.

He showed us a review item. The first part was a box label Netrix and inside was another box which contained the second item a game called "Get Lucky". He then placed the outer box inside the inner box.

He then used the cards to demonstrate a Steampunk Attaboy that he made.

Mock Up Volume One: Shattered Reality

I normally like to try out the effects I review before putting virtual pen to paper. I'll either inflict them upon the wife, my magic club or present them in front of a lay audience. I'm a usual performer at a free monthly magic show at a neighborhood bookstore here in Seattle, which is a perfect venue to try out many of the effects I am given to evaluate.

However since this illusion requires a more time and money to construct than I was willing to put out. I can only hypothesize on how it would play.

The effect is thus. The magician enters the stage carrying a large 21" X 28" framed mirror. This is then placed in a contemporary looking stand and then covered with a piece of cloth. A hammer is then brought out and the mirror smashed. The audience hears the glass breaking and sees shards of shattered mirror falling to the stage floor. The cloth is then removed and the frame which formerly held the mirror is seen to be empty. The frame is recovered, the shattered shards vanished and the mirror miraculously revealed to be restored.

I would really like to see this trick performed. Seriously, before writing this review I looked online for a video demo. None was to be found. One would think that this would be marketing step one oh one when releasing a item of this nature to the magic community. The lack of an online demo video raises suspicion of the validity of this effect. So does the wishful photoshopped image that is not only used to promote this effect but also adorns its cover. At no time during the presentation of this illusion can you show the mirror cracked or broken in its frame. Again you show the mirror, cover it with a cloth, and smash the cloth covered mirror with a hammer. The audience sees the fractured mirror fragments fall to the floor and then you uncover the frame to show it empty save for a single shard hanging from the top of the frame. The image of the performer standing next to a beautifully spider web pattern broken mirror is wishful thinking.

Other drawbacks to this effect are that it can really only be performed on stage and you will need the use of a sound system if you wish to have the sound of breaking glass accompany the actions of you smashing a mirror. You will also need to record the sound of breaking and falling glass yourself as no link to an appropriate sound effect file is included. So really it looks as if the drawbacks are outnumbering the benefits of this illusion. But I have been wrong before. But at least in my opinion this effect looks as if there are still a number of bugs to be worked out before it will become a workable and truly deceptive piece of magic.
