October Meeting Report

October's meeting theme was Prep for Holidays or Short Betweeners

Brian Melicher showed the club of brass tube, steel ball, and plunger. He put the brass tube on the back of his hand and place the steel ball into the tube. He put the plunger into the tube and pushed down. The ball went through the hand coming out on the other side. The plunger was removed from the tube and the tube was shown to be empty.

Paul Voulkman displayed a series of wooden rods, the rods had ridges cut into them and on one end of the rod was a propeller. When a stick was rubbed back and forward on the ridges of the rod the propeller would move. Paul showed that how you move the stick could control the direction and speed of the propeller.

Rich Waters had a show and tell item. He works at trades shows for a window company. Many times, there are "goodie bags" given to the vendors and sponsors. In one bag there was a deck of cards with a liquor company's logo on the backs. The cards had drink recipes on the back and the fronts had picture of old time items from the 1920's. Interesting to see. Rich then regaled us with his description of the worst magic show ever seen. Evan Shuster performed a card trick for us. A card was chosen from the deck then the deck was divided to three packets. The volunteer picked on of the packets and put his card into the packet. The three packets were combined then two other volunteers shuffled the cards in a face up and facedown manner. The deck was spread and the face up cards were pulled out and the volunteer was asked if he sees card, the answer was no. Evan had a second volunteer pick a number, the number was counted down to and the first volunteers card was at that number. This trick was by Karl Fulves and the principle used for the final reveal was the Quinta principle by Phill Smith Andrew Olmstead was back after a long absence, he borrowed a driver license and had a second volunteer hold the licenses in his hands. Andrew held out a wallet and had the volunteer look at the license in his hands and it was now Andrews license and in the wallet, was the 1st volunteers license. This was using a Tony Miller wallet.
