#### DEAD! by Orville Meyer The Jinx #38 November 1938

A Living and Dead test should concentrate upon the wallop of the effect rather than the method. This is impromptu, and while the presentation idea involved belongs to Eddie Clever, the method of handling and using billets instead of envelopes and cards is mine. In this form the billets can be torn out of borrowed paper without preparation or notice.

Use 5 or six billets about 2x3 inches. These are folded three times, or to a manipulation size. One is secretly dotted on the outside, or given an extra bend or kink. The slips are passed out, and the person getting the marked one is asked to write a dead name. The others write living names. Writers refold and drop into a hat, the collecting being done by a spectator.

The performer picks out a slip, making sure it isn't the dead one, and announces it as a living name. He opens to verify, nods, refolds and gives to man who collected slips. As an afterthought he has this man read name on slip aloud so writer can claim it. Now reach in and take dead slip, finger palming a live one. Slip is held to forehead and you announce it to be another LIVE one. Open for verification as before, READ THE DEAD NAME, nod, refold, switch slips in handing to assistant, and he reads the LIVE name and it is claimed by owner.

Take out third slip, dropping DEAD name back in hat. Repeat same procedure with this live slip. You have accustomed audience to your way of handling papers, and twice, first and third times, your hands are actually empty. For fourth time take out DEAD name. Build this up. Announce it to be dead name and ask for owner. Return paper to him and ask him to keep it closed. Then reveal the name, letter for letter. Everything can be examined and returned to owners, which is a point too many tricks cannot boast about

## Notes To Self By Phil Reda

## High Caliber - John Bannon's New Book

My main interest these days is Mentalism but my first love is card magic. I have been a huge John Bannon fan since his first major publication " Imposabilia" This summer he published " High Caliber" which is a compilation of all the small underground pamphlets and Tricks published in magazines over the last 20 years. The price tag is a little step at \$60 but there is some beautiful routines hidden between the covers. There are about 40 effects and that works out to about \$1.50 per trick - again this is a little on the step side. And some of the material is repeated with slight modifications ( this is a collection of previous publications) So the question is the price tag worth it- my answer is yes and no.

No if you already have some of the pamphlets - it would be a duplication as there are no new effect. The Pamphlets have been cleaned up and photos have been added but no new handling's - this seems to be the major complaint.

Yes if you do not have any of John's work. There is something for everyone of all skill levels. From self-working to more advanced - there are no knuckle busters (sorry). By more advanced we are talking Intermediate skill level - double lift, Elmsly count, etc..

What I like about John's work is he not only covers the method in detail but the thinking that goes behind the effect. John is a lawyer by profession and he applies his analytical skill to go to the heart of each trick and how psychology is applied to each effect. John is also known for thinking outside the box and relying on simple slights or subtitles and inventing his own moves when required. My favorite self- working trick in the book is Origami Poker. This is an amazing effect that will fool

Poker. This is an amazing effect that will fool yourself when you perform it. A packet of 16 face cards are shown. The packet is divided in half and one half is turned face down and shuffled into the face up half until there is a single packet. Again the cards are face up and face up and face down

. The performer never touches the packet and the Spector shuffled and folded the cards onto each other as they wanted - when they spread the packet the only face up cards are a royal flush in spades..

As I said there is something for everyone - from packet tricks to poker deals.

My only negative comment is the mentalism tricks - they tend be more mental magic then mentalism. Magicians have a hard time leaving a mental mystery alone they tend to add some sort of twist like color changes or cards appearing in pocket that sort of thing which waters down the mystery and hints of a trick instead - my opinion of course.

Most slights are explained - especially if it something the author concocted. As I mentioned above Mr Bannon thinks outside the box and has some interesting and clever slights. I was impressed with his version of the Hamman Count - he literally stood the slight on it's head and now it looks like an overhand shuffle- very deceptive.

So did I get my money's worth - I think so because as I mentioned I am a Bannon junky. My only complaint and this is universal of all magic offered today and that is what kind of presentation or framing can be applied to the trick - they tend to fall into what I call the so what catagory. There are a few tricks in the book that even Mr Bannon says he struggles with the presentation.

So what can I say about this one? Not much. It's a hollowed out light bulb with a cork in it. That pretty much sums it up. Oh yes, you get an instruction sheet with a couple of tricks you can do with it if you don't happen to own a mechanical milk in light bulb trick. All use a paper bag as the switching device. All of them follow the same thread.

Light bulb is removed from lamp.

Light bulb is placed in paper bag.

A substance such as milk or salt is vanished.

Light bulb is dumped out of bag.

Light bulb is discovered to contain previously vanished substance.

Bag is surreptitiously put aside before anyone can ask to look inside it.

It's the type of effect one would expect find in an old Bill Severn make it yourself from objects around your home beginner magic book. Of the three effects provided one is practical, another doable with some modification and the third is feasible only on paper. After reading it one wonders if the creator ever actually tried to do it himself. So unless you need a replacement bulb for your milk in light bulb apparatus or have an idea for a trick in which you need a hollowed out light bulb with a cork in it but don't wish to go to the trouble of making it yourself. Then this is the trick for you. Otherwise I'd pass this one by.

## DICE CUP CATCH

BET: Wager that one cannot hold a pair of dice on the side of a glass or dice cup and toss both inside.

Ask someone to hold a dice cup or a non-tapered glass with their right hand. They should also pinch a die, between their middle finger and thumb, with the same hand so that it rests against the outside of the glass. Ask them to use their left hand to balance another die on top of the first (Fig. 1). The challenge is to toss both dice into the cup or glass one at a time without the use of their other hand. The pair of dice must be in the glass simultaneously to win.



When attempting this they'll learn that tossing the first die into the cup is pretty easy. However when they try tossing the second die inside it is much more difficult. Mainly because the first die wants to fly out of the glass when trying to toss the second one inside. Of course one should be careful if using a real glass over a non-carpeted floor.

SECRET: Toss and catch the uppermost die in the cup. To catch the remaining die inside simply release the die and drop your right hand holding the cup toward the floor briskly about eight inches. Then it's a simple matter to move the downward moving cup under the falling die to catch it inside (Fig. 2). The downward momentum allows the die already inside the cup to stay inside. Give this bit 100% and you'll be doing it in no time. You should always give 100% unless you are donating blood.
