Evan Shuster brought to the meeting the Program from Magic Live, and a Tenyo item (3D Illusion). He brought a DVD with a Dai Vernon interview and we watch a sample of the DVD. "Revelations" DVD from LLepub.com or LL.com.

We are looking for people to be officers of the club.

Pain took out two decks one red, one blue and had a volunteer chose a deck and deal a number chosen by the volunteer face down. The same is done with the other deck. The top card from each pile is removed and place in the opposite deck. The cards are revealed and show to match, and all the other cards are shown to be blank face. Craig Colombel performed soap bubble to solid, with patter about the moments in life that are fragile and the memories that stay.
