This is a great trick! Gross, disgusting, and geeky yes, but a great trick, nonetheless. I freely admit that being a former guest geek in the Jim Rose Circus Sideshow makes me a bit biased towards this esoteric aspect of magic and I understand that pulling a piece of previously swallowed thread out of your ocular socket isn't going to be everyone's cup O' tea. But for those of us here that find ourselves frequently pushing at the boundaries of convention Thread will become an excellent addition to our arsenal.

Wayne Houchin has been using this effect as an opener and a reputation maker for several years now. Criss Angel even obtained permission from Mr. Houchin so he too could perform it on the first season of Mindfreak. It's that strong (and disturbing) of an effect.

The performer breaks off a foot and a half-length of thread from a spool. This he then proceeds to swallow. When all but six or seven inches of the thread has been consumed, and after an appropriate amount of ghastly facial gyrations has been made, the magician reaches up to his eye (yes his eye!) and proceeds to extract the thread. As he slowly pulls on the thread coming out of his eye the end of the thread hanging out his mouth retracts up and in. This creates the perfect illusion of the performer giving himself an "eye floss" as Mr. Houchin likes to call it.

Be warned, however. This is indeed a geek trick. And as with many stunts of this type it requires a certain level of sacrifice. You will need to place a gimmick into your eye. While this may sound extreme to many it really is no different than what is needed to be done is setting up for the classic Indian Bean Mystery or putting in an odd contact lens. For the squeamish Mr. Houchin has provided a second method which uses sleight of hand. This non-geek method requires no direct contact with one's eye. But as you might already suspect this version isn't nearly as strong nor convincing as the primary geek method. But it affords everyone the opportunity to freak out their friends, neighbors and co-workers as well as giving the performer a viable out if asked to "do it again so George can see it". This is nice to have ready and at your disposal since the reset time for the geek version is a few minutes and must be done in private. The DVD is well produced, perhaps overly so. It starts out like a music video and then goes into a Blainesc taping of Mr. Houchin performing the feat for a bunch of college kids at a Halloween party. Next, we are treated to a video of Wayne presenting the trick at one of his many stage performances. After this we finally get into the actual workings of both versions of the effect.

Interspersed between all these scenes are interviews where Mr. Houchin explains how he came to create the effect and many of his tips and philosophies about the performance of it.

Also included are sections on prop management, further interviews with Wayne and, to avoid the current stigma surrounding the single trick DVD, he teaches us his handling of the Gypsy Thread.

No supplies are offered with the DVD but everything you need to perform the primary geek version of this trick is easily found at your corner drugstore or local fabric shop.

If you wimp out and opt only to perform the second sleight of hand method of this feat, you will need yet another commodity which is only available from a magic shop. Yet another reason to learn and perform the much superior geek method of this fine and disturbing trick
