Comedy for Magicians and Others: Volume One

Robert Baxt is a funny man. At least that's what his business card says. It also appears that Robert Baxt is a generous man as he wants to help you be funny too. At least that's what it says on the back of his latest DVD "Comedy for Magicians and Others: Volume One".

Well actually it says "You Can Be Funny!" in large friendly letters. But you get my drift.

So of course this does beg the question. Will you be funny after viewing this DVD?

To which the answer is. Yes, but only if you were funny before you started watching it.

To be honest. Being funny is something that cannot be taught. It can be learned and better yet honed to a razor like sharpness. But there isn't a 12 Step Program one can follow that, once completed, will assure you of being a Wild and Crazy Guy that's the Life of the Party. Becoming Funny is a process that can, for the most part, only be learned by doing. So, if you're not funny now, don't expect to watch this DVD and then be able to knock ém dead at your local Comedy Club on open mike night (which is every night isn't it?)

What you will find on this DVD is valuable information, information drawn from years of experience, all of it from an award winning comic magician working in the real world.

Mr. Baxt discusses his philosophy on humor and delves into topics such as Character, Communication, Bonding with the Audience, Confidence, Props and Tricks as well as many insightful tips and advice on things to avoid. There are also many wonderful anecdotes including a marvelous tale about Al Flosso and Houdini's Wand.

Be forewarned however. This is Mr. Baxt's philosophy on comedy and presentation. It is not the be all and end all. Not that Mr. Baxt ever claims it is. The advice he gives is what has worked out best for him over the years. Your results may vary.

But if you're just starting out on the road to comedy, or a beginner looking for a few pointers this DVD is a good place to start. Again you should know that there are no tricks or jokes included on this DVD. Just advice.

For myself I would have liked to have seen a little more examples given to help illustrate some of the finer points covered in this recording. But that's just me. I also would have liked to have seen some discussion on the various types of humor and the basic tenants of what makes something funny. But then this is after all just volume one and there needs to be topics left over to talk about on the upcoming volumes.
