### Ethics & Magic

One of the things that I love about this club, the magicians of the US Pacific Northwest and British Columbia is that there are so many high caliber and imaginative performers.

We be big and mighty ugly rich with excellent and creatively talented performers. Out of respect for these performers, you and the magical arts, I feel that as my presidency of this club nears its close I would like to address some ethical issues.

Even though everyone knows that it is wrong to borrow/steal artistic, intellectual or physical aspects of others acts and performance businesses we still see it everyday. It is the number one reason why professional most and semiprofessional magicians avoid contact with magic clubs and other magicians in general. Because the thieves seem to profit in the short term many fail to realize, or understand, that those who they have wronged as well as the injured artist's acquaintances never forget. That can be very costly in the long run.

Sometimes the theft is very blatant such as Proof Positive's piracy of Dirk Losander's Floating Table. In their ads they even use language that suggests that Dirk and Tommy Wonder are involved to a point. They are not involved and they are not happy. The truth will come out Sometimes the theft is a little more grey in appearance but still bad such as the gate crashers at the last PCAM. Sometimes the theft and deception is subtle to an observer but just as damaging. Such as those the credit for who take other works performers' and accomplishments. For example at that same PCAM a performer who put together an imaginative act which took first place in one of the had competitions his accolades diminished by a local high profile magician who immediately began siphoning off credit by claiming that he mentored this performer and this act. He did not contribute even one single idea to this act nor is he a "mentor" to this performer. He has done this to other performers who were not at all surprised by this latest.

Not considered by the examples above who were thinking of saving time, money and effort by lifting the hard work of others is the time, money and effort expenses of losing trust and respect. It is much more satisfying to advance on your own work and merits.

As I wrote in the beginning of this letter I love the imaginative creativity, vision and enthusiasm of the talent in this club and the area. I feel that we must encourage, recognize and preserve the work and creations of we the magicians of The Northwest Ring of Fire.
